What is "Formation"? - an introduction





Do not be conformed to this world but be **transformed** [metamorpheo - undergo a change of form; metamorphosis] by the renewal of your mind, that you may prove what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect. [Rom 12.2]

Definitions—

- "form" noun: shape, visible aspect
 - ['conditions of a thing's existence by knowing which we can produce it' Francis Bacon]
 - verb: to fashion, to mould (includes develop a habit/contract an alliance)
- "transform" noun: undergoing change, metamorphosis
 - verb: to make a change in the character/ dispositions
- "conformity" likeness to

Formation involves—

- "transformation"
- "conformation"
- "information"

United by their vocation as "brothers and sisters of penance", and motivated by the dynamic power of the Gospel, let them **conform their thoughts and deeds to those of Christ** by means of that radical interior change which the Gospel itself calls "conversion".

[Rule, 7]

The **journey of formation**, which should develop throughout life, begins with entrance into the fraternity. Mindful that the Holy Spirit is the principal agent of formation and always attentive to collaboration with him, those responsible for formation are: the candidate, the entire fraternity, the council with the minister, the master of formation, and the assistant.
