1. A Gift of the Spirit

IIII Celebration, Eucharist, Baptism & Profession

So, how's it going? Everything clear so far?



Not bad. Of course, the commission, as you call it, is from the King [Christ himself] who calls us by the Holy Spirit to become, if you like, a part of this regiment [OFS] in the Franciscan army [Family] whose overall mission is to 'Repair the Church!'

Yeah, I think I've got it. I think you're saying getting professed is more like getting a royal commission than enlisting? That being done in the context of the mass etc means its got the stamp of the Church itself—a really serious undertaking?

CELEBRATION

Gift of the Spirit in celebration =
'sanctification'[makes us holy], which comes
through the priest, from God, because he acts
in persona Christi

Purpose here: 'May the Spirit of your love penetrate their hearts, so that your grace will strengthen their commitment to the gospel life' [Ritual II, 30] - Spirit confirms what he has begun [Ritual II, 27]

Presbyter—one who channels blessing to professed; professed = privileged beneficiaries of this presiding function of the priest



EUCHARIST

The mass, as the source & summit of our salvation, is the right setting for Profession for in it the Church associates the promise [Profession] with the Eucharistic sacrifice

- the true nature of candidates as both priests & victims is made manifest: by promising to live the gospel life they make themselves entirely available to God, placing their bodies [persons] on the altar of Christ's sacrifice
- Profession = not instantaneous, isolated,
 act but new existential situation commitment for life; 'person in a new state'
- from now on, every time one attends the mass, there is a sense in which that Profession is being renewed
- this 'sacrifice' <u>confirms & seals</u> the commitment to live the gospel life

BAPTISM

Baptism makes us living members of the Church for by it we are incorporated into Christ's death & resurrection [Rom 6.3ff], and we are sealed with the promised Holy Spirit [Eph 1.13] as the Rule reminds us, the relationship between baptism & Profession is fundamental:

'They have been made living members of the Church by being buried and raised with Christ in baptism; they have been <u>united more intimately with the Church by</u> Profession...' [Rule, 6], and so:

'You have been made members of the People of God by baptism...Do you wish to bind yourself more closely to the Church & to work intently to rebuild the ecclesial community...? [Ritual II, 31] - where the response is renewal of baptismal promises, & new consecration in Profession

- Profession in the OFS helps one to live baptismal grace & consecration with greater intensity of commitment & diligence [Ritual I, 12]
- Profession, by its nature, is renovation of the consecration & promises of baptism; Profession = the 'memorial of baptism' [Gk 'anamnesis' = memorial/bringing to mind again by bringing past to present: as in the mass 'a memorial of Christ's death' the Real Presence]
- so, Profession makes baptism more fruitful, stronger & richer [cf Lumen Gentium, 44a]
