Chapter 1. The Essence of Franciscan Spirituality

A spirituality is a particular way, or emphasis, in following Christ...many things are common to all Christians...There is no difference in our goals and in many of our ways and means. But there is a difference in what we can only be called emphasis...

Perhaps the idea can best be illustrated in this way. Several bands may each play the same piece. But the results from a rock group playing are not the same as those heard on your public broadcasting station!...

Differing spiritualities depend largely on the personalities of their founders and times in which religious communities developed...

One Franciscan writer has said, 'If anything specific can be observed about St Francis, it is his great concern to desire *nothing* specific.' Francis' spirituality was simply to 'observe the Gospel.' Yet because he was a unique and attractive personality, the Church gained a unique charism called Franciscan spirituality...The <u>great Franciscan emphasis</u>, then, is on the fact that God is love...[and] Franciscans choose to emphasise it as St Francis did.

The rule and life of the Secular Franciscans is this: to observe the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ by following the example of St Francis of Assisi, who made Christ the inspiration and the centre of his life with God and people.

Christ, the gift of the Father's love, is the way to him, the truth into which the Holy Spirit leads us, and the life which he has come to give abundantly.

Secular Franciscans should devote themselves especially to careful reading of the Gospel, going from Gospel to Life and Life to the Gospel. (Rule 4)
