Appendices (a) Prayer as a Relationship with God



## Heb 10. 12, 19, 21-24, 36-39

But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, 'he sat down at the right hand of God',...Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus,...and since we have a great priest over the house of God, let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching...For you need endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may received what was promised. For yet 'in a very little while, the one who is coming will come and will not delay; but my righteous one will live by faith. My soul takes no pleasure in anyone who shrinks back.' But we are not among those who shrink back and so are lost, but among those who have faith and so are saved.
