The local fraternity is to be established canonically. It becomes the basic unit of the whole Order and a visible sign of the Church, the community of love. This should be the privileged place for developing a sense of Church and the Franciscan vocation and for enlivening the apostolic life of its members. Rule 22

The Fraternity Meeting is:

both an occasion for visitors to experience life in fraternity and ongoing formation. Both of these are important in that visitors must have the chance to see for themselves what is central to OFS commitment—life in fraternity, and to experience for themselves the formative process—which is lifelong.

Why "fraternity"?

...Francis could not remain alone for two reasons. He was a 'people person' and the Lord is also a 'people person'. These reasons created Francis into a kind of human magnet to others who observed his way of life and who experienced his spiritual growth. He could not have remained alone if he had wanted to. The life he had chosen was simply too attractive to others who loved the Lord...For that reason, those who are called to follow Francis are called to fraternity as community...Fraternity keeps us from becoming self-centred. Fraternity creates the place where apostolic work in the world is fostered. Fraternity gives us strength where we are weak. Fraternity gives us opportunities to love others with all their goodness as well as their flaws and irritating ways. And they can do the same for us. Fraternity provides an intimate spiritual family within the larger spiritual family of the Church where we can grow in holiness...In fraternity we are reminded of our Franciscan charism. Meeting provides opportunities to work together. Individuals grow in friendship in the Lord and each other as they pray together, work together, motivate each other, share their faith journeys. Fraternities are havens of joy where laughter and humour lighten life's burdens. Fraternities provide a place to learn to resolve disagreements peaceably. Fraternities are places to learn to forgive ourselves and others as we begin again and again to follow Francis and Jesus.

So then, putting away falsehood, let all of us speak the truth to our neighbours, for we are members of one another.
